

Preventative Health Care Plan for Dogs.

Procedures are in place to ensure accommodated dogs are cared for to ensure their good health and to prevent any health issues from arising, and to monitor for any potential health issues while they are in our care.

Dog care

Action	Procedure
Ensure vaccinations valid	<p>Vaccinations must be licensed for UK use, and Titre tests must be done yearly; it may be requested to get tested early in some instances. A primary vaccination must have been carried out for the titre test to be accepted.</p> <p>Primary vaccination courses must be completed at least two weeks before attending.</p>
Vaccination checks	<p>We require sight of up-to-date vaccination or titre test records for all dogs in our care.</p> <p>Immunisations are required against:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - canine parvovirus - canine distemper - canine adenovirus - infectious canine hepatitis - leptospirosis <p>Kennel cough (<i>Bordetella bronchiseptica</i>/ canine parainfluenza) is recommended but not required.</p>
Parasite control	<p>We require evidence that the dogs have been treated for internal and external parasites before attending daycare.</p> <p>If any parasites – fleas, ticks, lice - become evident, a second treatment may be required before the dog can attend.</p>
Health checks	<p>Each dog is checked before attendance and at least once weekly for signs of pain, suffering, injury, disease, or abnormal behaviours. Vulnerable animals are checked more frequently. Signs of pain,</p>

	suffering, injury, disease, or abnormal behaviour are recorded. Where signs of ill health are noted, owners are immediately informed, and the dog may be taken to a veterinarian; the advice from a vet is followed.
Staff training	All staff are trained in dog handling, dog first aid and how to monitor animals for any signs of injury or disease.
