Monitoring new dogs

To comply with the Animal Welfare (Licensing of Activities involving Animals) Regulations 2018, we have policies and procedures in place to monitor dogs coming into our care, to ensure they are happy as well as healthy.

Action	Procedure
Pre-attendance assessment	We arrange meet and greets with all potential dog to assess their behaviour in a public setting with their owners.
Initial greeting and pick-up	For the first trial day the owners are present at home for the pick up. The dog is introduced to the staff member, their body language is assessed. If the dog is then comfortable, the dog is taken to the vehicle by the staff member and isolated away from other dogs when travelling. The behaviour and interactions are monitored throughout.
Observe dogs after arrival to identify	The new dog will be slowly introduced to

If abnormal behaviour is noted	Any abnormal behaviour is immediately
	reported to the owner and the appropriate
