# Lost or Missing Dog Policy:

#### **Preventative Measures:**

Prior to walks, ensure all dogs are properly secured with appropriate leashes, harnesses, or restraints.

Use double leashes or secure attachment points to minimise the risk of accidental escapes.

Conduct a thorough check of equipment to ensure it is in good condition before each walk.

### Immediate Response:

If a dog runs off or goes missing during a walk, remain calm and assess the situation auickly.

Notify all staff members immediately to assist in the search efforts.

If possible, enlist the help of nearby pedestrians or residents to aid in the search.

#### Communication with the Owner:
